THE POSITION OF PREPOSITIONS IN RELATIVE CLAUSES

→ When the main verb has a preposition, the verb and the preposition have to be always together:

Tom is *talking to a woman – do you know her?*

Do you know the woman (who/that) Tom is talking to?

I <u>slept</u> **in** a bed last night – it wasn't very comfortable.

The bed (that/which) I <u>slept in</u> last night wasn't very comfortable.

→ More examples:

Are these the books (that/which) you <u>were looking **for**</u>? The woman (who/that) he <u>fell in love **with**</u> left him after a month. The man (who/that) I <u>was sitting **next to**</u> on the plane talked all the time.
